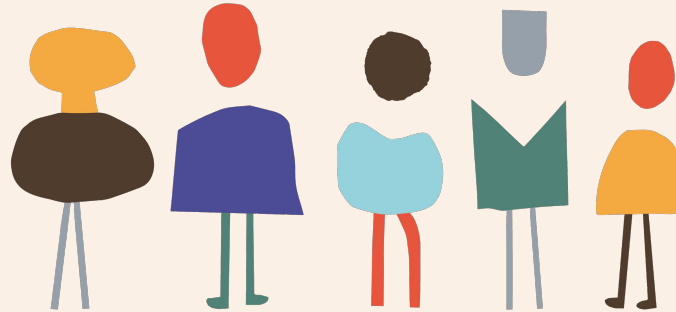

# 9th Grade Demographics

## 111 9th graders

- 41 are siblings of current or former Shasta students
- 100% of our 9th graders are coming to us from within the district
  - 40 different middle schools are represented in our freshmen class
    - 11 from TRP, 26 from Fernando, and 13 from Ben Franklin; other strongly represented schools are Our Lady of Mercy, Bayshore, and FDR (increase from all of these target middle schools, year over year)
  - 37 of our 9th graders are returning to the district from private schools

We will work to ensure future classes reflect the diversity of the Jefferson Union High School District. A Community Engagement Manager continues work to ensure our demographics are more closely aligned with JUHSD
