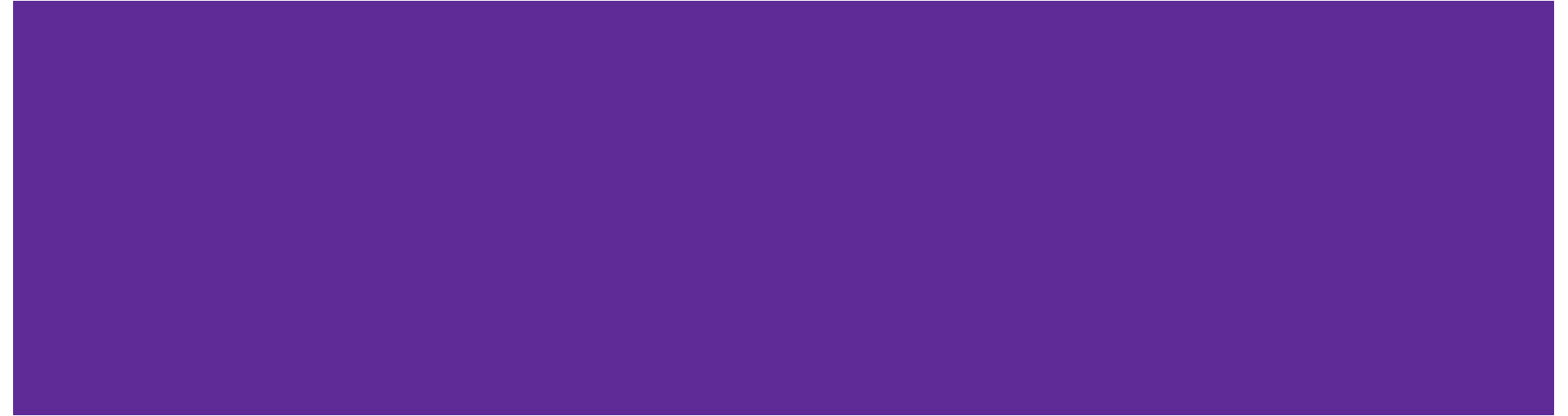

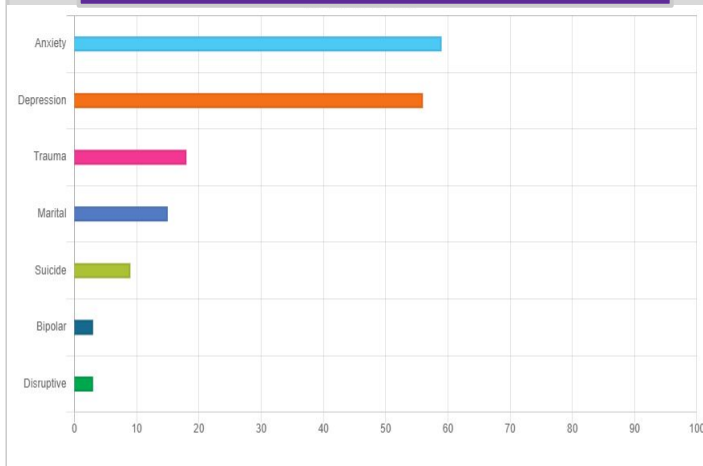

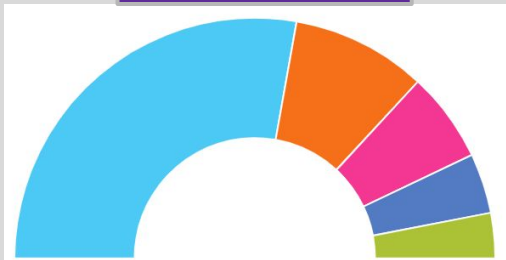

**WHITE: 55%**

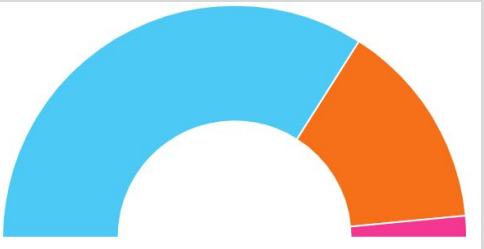

## GENDER

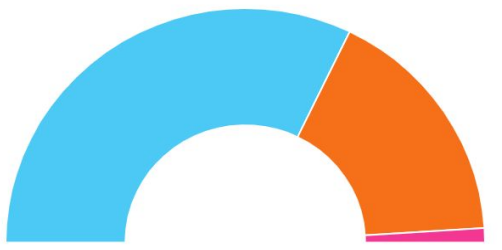


**FEMALE: 68%**

# Concerns

- Suicide assessments down by about  $\frac{1}{2}$  -  $\frac{2}{3}$  (last year Aug-Dec = 67)
- Lack of access to students
- Students not engaged/not showing up for sessions
- Students not on camera (hard to relate, soothe, and assess)
- Extreme stress is compounding - many cases are overwhelming by the time we get them
- We are under the same stress - Covid, election, working from home, parenting, etc... (Chronic stress is hard to navigate); teachers, too
- Lack of in-person time means less eyes on kiddos
- Families in extreme conditions (exacerbated) = lack of basic resources
- Getting back to 1:1 in-person sessions
- What students will be dealing with when we return
